



John Sibley Butler is Professor of Management and Sociology and is the Director of the IC<sup>2</sup> Institute and the Herb Kelleher Center for Entrepreneurship and Small Business (McCombs School of Business) at The University of Texas at Austin. As Director of IC<sup>2</sup>, he is responsible for The Austin Technology Incubator, which has created over 230 enterprises. Four of the enterprise have gone public and over 35 have been acquired. At present, the Austin Technology Incubator concentrates on creating cutting edge companies in Clean Energy, Wireless/IT and Bio-technology. IC<sup>2</sup> is an interdisciplinary research unit that has 18 Endowed Fellows and over 280 Fellows worldwide.

His research areas are organizational science, with special emphasis on military and entrepreneurial organizations. As Director of the Herb Kelleher Center, he is responsible for supporting research in the areas of entrepreneurship, growth and renewal. His articles appear in diverse journals, including the *American Sociological Review*, *Social Science Quarterly*, *Sociological Perspectives*, *Journal of Business Research* and *Journal of Developmental Entrepreneurship*. His books include *The Development of University-Based Entrepreneurship Eco-Systems* (with Fetters, Greene and Rice) *Global Perspectives on Technology Transfer and Commercialization* (with David Gibson, March 2011) *All That We Can Be* (with Charles C. Moskos and winner of the Washington Monthly Book Award), *Immigrant and Minority Entrepreneurship* (with George Kozmetsky) and *Entrepreneurship and Self-Help Among Black-Americans* and *An American Story: Entrepreneurship and Wealth Creation among Mexican Americans*.

His recent awards include The Technology Innovation Special Achievement Award (Austin Business Journal), The 2010 Champions of Small Business Award (NCFC), Booker T. Washington Award for his efforts in the area of new venture creation and business start-ups and The Ph.D. Project Award. Was appointed to the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board by President George W. Bush and is a decorated Vietnam Veteran. He was the Regional Consultant for State Farm Insurance for 16 years.

He received his undergraduate degree from Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge and the Ph.D. from Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois.
